The Community Unified Response to Radiological Incidents & Emergencies (CURRIE) Tabletop

Exercise is a collaborative training initiative sponsored by the Department of Energy/ National Nuclear Security Administration and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. This exercise is designed to enhance the preparedness and response capabilities of various stakeholders in the event of a radiological incident.



Exercise Objectives

- Enhance Preparedness: Improve overall preparedness for radiological incidents.
- Foster stronger partnerships among participating agencies and organizations.
- Strengthen the coordination and communication among federal, state, local, and tribal agencies.



Exercise Features

The CURRIE Tabletop Exercise is a no-fault, non-evaluated exercise. This means that the focus is on learning and improving response capabilities without assigning blame or conducting formal evaluations of performance.
